CURRICULUM

Saugus High has a wide-ranging program of course offerings. The curriculum is designed to meet the needs of virtually all students, whether college-bound, vocationally oriented, or have special plans. There is a full complement of Advanced Placement and Honors courses, a regular college preparatory program, special education and a variety of vocational courses. HONORS

In May of 1999 Saugus was named a "California Distinguished School" for student achievement, use of technology and student support. We are the first and only high school in the Wm. S. Hart District to have achieved this recognition. In November 1999 the school was one of only seventeen high schools in the state to be nominated for National Blue Ribbon status.

CLASS RANK/G.P.A.

Class rank is based upon the student’s performance in all credit subjects, grades 9-12. All students and all subjects are included. All courses are based on a 4.0 scale, with the exception of Honors and AP courses, which are on a 5.0 scale. Rank is weighted and cumulative. Students with a 3.75 cumulative G.P.A. at the end of the seventh semester are honored at graduation as Honors Scholars.
